ow time flies... The last two years have been very busy for us. In the summer of 2005 we made the decision to install a Biomass heating system. This was the biggest project we have tackled to date and it was no easy task. We worked through the fall of 2005 and throughout the winter, but we had to break for spring 2006. We got the system operating in August of 2006. Because of the new system we decided to heat for an extended period in order to make sure it was operating properly. The consequence of that is an extra stock of perennials that we propagated and

overwintered. The system is now operational and has reduced our oil consumption to less than 5% of previous levels.

n a natural setting, the soil is teaming with different bacteria and fungus that break down old plant and animal material. There are many that form mutually beneficial relationships with the plant roots. The fungus get food given off by the plant roots and both fight off disease organisms and provide the plant with hard to come by nutrients. For years the goal in the greenhouse industry has been to make

everything sterile. The way to fight root and leaf disease was to apply lots of chemicals. The theory was exclusion and fight like hell to keep everything that way. Recently beneficial fungus have been added to commercial soil mixes with wonderful results. This mind set is



somewhat different. It recognizes the reality that living organisms are complex and can develop relationships with other organisms that are mutually beneficial. In fact it is very difficult to maintain a sterile environment so why not try to give the good guys a leg up? The result? The good guys will help you to maintain a healthy environment for the plants even in the presence of the bad guys. We have found that spraying the same organisms on the plants in cloudy humid weather has resulted in a huge drop in leaf problems. We have taken it one step further this year. Brian has been spraying the plants with a compost tea. So far we like what we see.

ew for 2007. "Own Root Roses" . All our rose bushes are grown from cuttings on their own root stock. This is not a very radical idea but the majority of roses now are grown as grafts on an alternative rootstock. So why should you care? These roses will never sucker and go wild. All the shoots that come from the rootstock will be true to the variety that you purchased. Since there is no graft the roses tend to be hardier (ie no danger of the graft being killed). We have made a selection of roses that have the best hardiness



and disease resistance available
